## Pearls from the Pulpit

There are many times in life when we are faced with tough situations, tough circumstances, and tough decisions. As a matter of fact, there are times in which life can be rather disappointing. Despite one's level of dedication, commitment, and love for God there are times when we are all faced with the storms and tragedies of life. The American poet, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, wrote in his poem The Rainy Day, "Be still, sad heart, and cease repining; behind the clouds is the sun still shinning; thy fate is the common fate of all into each life some rain must fall, some days must be dark and dreary." Longfellow was simply trying to tell us that life is filled with ups and downs, and the storms you are going through, while unique too you, are not new under the sun. Stop punishing yourself by believing that you have somehow fallen out of the favor of God and that you are the only one going through a rigorous trial. In the gospel according to Matthew 5:45 Jesus said, "...he maketh His sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust."

Despite your spiritual status, whether saint or sinner, you are going to face some challenges as you travel along the highway of life. The good news for those who love God and who have a relationship with Him through the shed blood of Jesus is that you can face your disappointments calmly with the assurance that God has made you more than a conqueror. To those who don't know the Lord, the response of Christians to disappointments may appear strange and ridiculous. The child of God is not oblivious to heartaches, pains, and sufferings but understands their position as Kingdom citizens and know that the way out of a dilemma is to literally turn your disappointments into praises!

In the Old Testament book of Genesis we find the story of a wife who never truly had first place in the eyes of her husband. Leah, the older sister of Rachel, was given to Jacob by means of deception. The Bible records that Jacob was passionately in love with Rachel who was beautiful and desirable. Jacob agreed to work seven years for Laban, the father of both Rachel and Leah, in exchange for the hand of his youngest daughter. After the seven years were concluded Jacob and Rachel were wed in a public ceremony. However on the honeymoon night Laban slipped Leah into the wedding bed and was not discovered until the next day. Jacob was shocked, surprised, and angry the die had been cast and the relationship consummated! In other words, it was too late, whether he wanted her or not Leah was now his wife. Jacob's love for

Rachel was stronger than the deception of Laban and the "weak eyed" condition of Leah! Consequently he agreed to work another seven years to obtain his true love.

What a disappointment Leah must have endured. realizing that while married to Jacob she could never truly be the "apple of his eve." It is during disappointing moments that the saints of God know to turn to call on God. In Genesis 29:31 the Word of God says, "And when the Lord saw that Leah was hated, he opened her womb: but Rachel was barren." Each time Leah felt disappointed she called on the Lord and God blessed her. Whenever she would give birth she gave a testimony chronicling her disappointing situation and the victory that God gave her. "...She said surely the Lord hath looked upon my affliction; now therefore my husband will love me...Because the Lord hath heard that I was hated, he hath therefore given me this son also...Now this time will my husband be joined unto me, because I have born him three sons..." {Genesis 29:32-34} Unfortunately, her status and position within the family structure remained unchanged. Sadder still is the fact that while she is crying out to God, her focus is not necessarily on the relationship she has with God but on the earthly relationship she desires to have with Jacob. It is not until the birth of her fourth child that her testimony changes. In Genesis 29:35 the Bible states, "And she conceived again, and bare a son: and she said, now will I praise God: therefore she called his name Judah..." The name Judah literally means *praised!* There are some storms that only cease when we learn to truly trust God and praise our way out.

Regardless as to who may have hurt us or disappointed us along the way we must learn to turn our disappointments into our praises. If you whine and complain about all of the hurtful experiences that you've endured in this life you will never be able to move forward to those things that are rewarding. Mourning over past broken and failed relationships can only serve to sabotage and hurt present and future relationships. The fact that you may have been

physically, emotionally, and spiritually wounded by those who should have been your protector and your strength is not an indication or indictment against all others. It was in the midst of being rejected and being second best that Leah mustered the strength to praise God anyway. Despite her physical malady, despite the fact that she was given to Jacob through deceptive means, and despite the fact that she shares a husband with her younger sister, Leah declared I will

praise God. She may not have felt like praising the Lord but she praised Him nonetheless. Our praises to God have nothing to do with our feelings or emotions; they are the result of our intellectual or mental will. In other words, we must mentally will ourselves to praise Jesus in the midst of suffering; not because we feel like it but because intellectually we know that it is right to praise Him! TURN YOUR **DISAPPOINTMENTS INTO YOUR PRAISE!**

## **BRIDGES**

Four years ago, Humbled Hearts Ministries, 501c3 arm of St. John Praise & Worship Center, introduced a program to the public called BRIDGES. BRIDGES is a bible based 12-step recovery support group for persons suffering with addictions and choose to include Jesus Christ in their recovery process. This program is available to anyone 18 years of age and older and offers support for ANY addiction. People suffer in so many areas of their lives because they fail to look at the real issue of addiction, YOU and your loss of control. So many habits that we consider as "the norm" control our day to day situations so much that we fail to realize the control that it has taken over the choices we make each day.

BRIDGES will help you understand what the recovery process is for addictions and who it is for, which in all honesty most of the time is yourself. We ALL suffer from some sort of addiction.

We must realize that addictions are not just from drugs and alcohol. People struggle with food, gambling, low self-esteem, and unhealthy relationships, just to name a few. God has anointed this support group to be able to accept, understand and work to overcome the addiction through the recovery process. We study from the Life Recovery Bible which teaches the 12 steps to recovery of addictions and the Word of God. Without God, there is no true recovery.

BRIDGES is excited for the things to come in 2012. We believe that manifestation of the vision Resurrection House is coming soon. Resurrection House will be a 90-day post treatment facility for persons recovering from their addictions. God moves each week within the group. Please continue to pray for our group. Together, with help of the Lord, we will see lives change one step at a time.
